

GREAT BRISTOL OUTHOUSE RACE RULES PLEASE READ THESE RULES CAREFULLY ALTHOUGH THERE AREN'T MANY RULES, YOU MAY RISK DISQUALIFICATION IF YOU DON'T COMPLY and please be sure that you have filled out and submitted your entry form and paid your entry fee.

Please meet in front of Holley Hall at about 8:30 AM. Race begins at 9:00 AM and lasts about 1 1/2 hours.

1. NO ROPES MAY BE USED TO PROPEL THE OUTHOUSE FRAMES! Runners must push or pull the frames without ropes.
2. A TEAM HAS TWO RUNNERS AND ONE RIDER. All team members must be 13 years old or older.
3. THE RIDER MUST WEAR A SAFETY HELMET.
4. THE RIDER'S SEAT MUST BE FIRMLY ATTACHED TO THE FRAME
5. DECORATIONS: YOUR OUTHOUSE FRAME DECORATIONS MUST INCLUDE
 1. THREE SIDES (a back, and enclosures on each side)
 2. NONE OF THE DECORATIONS MAY STICK OUT BEYOND THE EDGES OF THE FRAME BY MORE THAN A FEW INCHES. (Please don't use nails to fasten decorations- use staples or tape)
6. CASTERS: YOUR FRAME COMES EQUIPPED WITH 2 INCH CASTERS. YOU MAY REPLACE THESE WITH CASTERS OF YOUR OWN CHOOSING, BUT THEY MAY NOT BE ANY LARGER THAN 3 INCHES AND MUST SWIVEL THROUGH 360 DEGREES. At the conclusion of the race, please replace your casters with the casters that initially came with your frame. OTHER THAN ABOVE, PLEASE DO NOT MODIFY YOUR FRAME.
7. IF AT ANY POINT PRIOR TO RACE DAY YOU DETECT A PROBLEM WITH ANY PART OF YOUR FRAME OR IT'S CASTERS, PLEASE CONTACT TED LYLIS AT 453-3751 (tlylis@gmavt.net).
8. ON THE DAY OF THE RACE IF YOU DETECT PROBLEMS, THERE IS A PERSON WITH A TWO-WAY RADIO AT THE STARTING LINE, ONE AT THE FINISH LINE, AND ONE AT THE REGISTRATION TENT. PLEASE HAVE ONE OF THEM CONTACT TED LYLIS (we have a ready supply of replacement casters and parts on site).
9. THE DECISIONS OF THE JUDGES AT THE STARTING LINE, THE JUDGES AT THE FINISH LINE, AND THE RACE ORGANIZER ARE FINAL. We only want everyone to have a safe and fun time.
10. PLEASE STRIP ALL OF YOUR DECORATIONS FROM THE OUTHOUSE FRAME AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE RACE. .
11. PLEASE PUT YOUR FRAME ON THE MEDIAN STRIP BETWEEN THE POST OFFICE AND THE MERCHANTS BANK.
